• GC Advantage (9.30am-12.30pm)

Croquet NZ will adopt the Rules of Advantage GC as the recognised GC Handicap format from the beginning of the 24/25 season. This coaching session will introduce the game of Advantage GC and support our club transition to this format. • Rush TGfU (1pm-4.30pm)

This GC/AC variant offers attributes of both Codes, combining GC and AC elements with a shorter and more interactive game format. Rush TgfU (*Teaching Game for Understanding*) is a tactically rich game that is easily manipulated to support new players and seasoned internationals alike with new tactical and practical challenges (examples will be presented at the session).
