AGM May 2000 Life membership was given to Gwen Ninness. Gwen had given sterling service to the sport at club level in two districts over a period of twenty years. That service included holding positions as a committee member, Vice club Captain and Club Captain, President, and coach of new players for several years. She has continued to help and encourage new players over the years and has given many hours to umpiring matches at both club and WCA events. She joined the Paraparaumu club in 1987 as a dual member moving to Paraparaumu after seven years as a member of the Plimmerton Croquet Club where she also served on the committee as described above. She has continued to offer the benefit of her experience and knowledge to the club membership and is always willing to help in any situation. Her involvement in fund-raising for the present club house covered many years, whether in baking cakes, raising plants for sale at garage sales or helping at garage sales. She was the guiding light in the production of our popular club recipe book which raised a significant amount of money for the then new club house. Her love of gardening has meant that she has spent many hours in the formation and maintenance of the gardens at the new complex, propagating many of the plants. Her photographic record of many club functions over the years has provided a valuable historical archive for the club.

#### Joy Allan:

Joy commenced playing croquet at the Khandallah Croquet Club and was Secretary/Treasurer from 1996-2002 and was also involved in coaching new members.

Joy joined the Paraparaumu Coquet Club with her husband Rob in 2002 and has held several club positions since that tie, including as Club Treasurer from 2005 for many years. In April 1998, authorisation was given for the signing between the Club and the Council of the land lease for the new clubhouse and Reg was appointed Project Manager for its building and practically lived on site, until August of that year saw the clubhouse completed. A clubhouse that any club would be proud of. However, with the growth in club membership, the club was finding the clubhouse too small and after considering a report that had been prepared, Reg's plan for the extension of the clubhouse was approved. Fundraising began once more and the actual building work began in mid-March 2007 and was completed May 2007. And this is the Clubhouse we have today.
